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## Ref. Report for 2023/2024 academic year

Dear Donna and Friends at Unicorn and FSTSG, Munich;

Kindly receive our sincere greeting and best sentiments.

My gratitude to all of you for the supports rendered to **From Street to School (Liberia), Inc.** With your support our children were able to smile, play, and remain in school. Schools are about to close in three weeks and will resume early September 2024 for academic year 2024/2025.

During the course of the year, we sponsored 43 students for 2023/2024 (26 female and 17 male) students in 25 schools in Montserrado, Nimba and Margibi counties. Eight out of the 43 students have completed the 12th grade. Five will be promoted to grade 12.

Our workshops mainly centered on skill training and capacity building for students.

Couple of them took interest in gardening, soap making, baking, dancing, computer and tailoring.

Gardening was on a smaller skill since most of our institutions could not provide space for the students.

Some were engaged in the planting of flowers and local crops like potato greens, eddoes, and cassava. Harvest was used to assist challenged students. Products from soap making, baking, sewing, etc. were used to help the workshop students secure lunch money for school. 45 of them graduated from the program.

The students, with joy remain very thankful for the opportunity. The workshops ran for free and students were charged some little amount to augment what was allotted for the program.

Constraints:

***Our constraint was getting adults to sign up for the classes to teach the students. Some charge a huge sum of money that we could not afford. Some were not regular for the program/workshop. No permanent space/land for our gardening activities because majority of our campuses do not have such facilities for the project.***

**Finance:**

**\$12,415** (United States Dollars) was raised for tuitions, other fees, workshops, and other students' activities. **\$7,801 USD** was expended for school fees for 43 students. **4,614 USD** was expended for 5 workshops, gardening program, one essay writing competition, debate, recreation, excursions and other activities for students. This year, more than 400 students benefited from the gardening-workshop, debate, essay competition, and students activities organized by our team. A buck of them took part in the debate

competition. Our radio program still carries the name Children's Voices and the number of students showing interest is increasing. It focuses on children knowing/understanding the rights and responsibilities in the society. It is aired every Saturday on ECOWAS radio ( link: <https://radio.garden/listen/ecowas-radio-91-5/oHTkPh0> recommended especially on Saturday Noon, Liberian Time)
